Assumption Religion School Completes Term

Another school year draws to a close this week with the students receiving their final report cards from Reverend Leonard A. Kelly, Pastor of the Assumption of Our Lady Church. June 2nd completes another year.

On the elementary and junior high level, the Assumption School of Religion staff instructed 702 students. The faculty includes four Sisters, Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart; Sr. Maureen, Principal; Sr. Mary Angela Sr. Mary Natalie and Sr. Mary Rene. They are assisted by three lay teachers: Mrs. Mary Firestone,

Mrs. Irene Mancuso and Mrs. Helen Bennett.

The high school division which includes 141 boys and girls are taught by Rev. Kelly and Rev. Nolan. Besides the 44 released time classes held per week at the school, the Sisters also conducted a Monday afternoon supplementary religion program for students from the Junior high and a Friday afternoon program for students from the 3rd, 4th and 5th grades.

In addition to this, special instructions were given to a class of 72 boys and girls who received the Sacrament of Confirmation from Bishop Kearney on April 27th, and to 66 second grade children who received their First Holy Communion on April 29th.

In the adult education program 41 mothers and college students from Fairport and the outlying districts came to the Assumption School on Monday afternoons to receive a teacher-training course conducted by Father Kelly and Sister Maureen. His Excellency, Bishop Kearney conferred Teacher certificates upon the 41 "new ambassadors of Christ" who successfully completed the course on Tuesday, May 23rd.

Shortly after the beginning of the year, adults interested in the teachings of the Catholic faith were welcomed to Monday and Friday evening sessions of instruction at the school by Father Kelly.
